TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress approved MARCH 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States" there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a certain tract of land in part of Henry C. Griffin's Private, Captain Brown's company, Minnesota Militia 1842-1843...

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon lots numbered one and two of Section twenty five in Township One hundred and twenty four of Range twenty eight in the District of Canada subject to sale at St. Cloud, Minnesota, containing twenty six acres and ninety seven hundredths of an acre.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, the same has been having been assigned by the said Henry C. Griffin to George Brown in whose favor the same tract has been located.

Now know all men, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said George Brown as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs...

the tract of land above described To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said George Brown as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs and assigns forever.
